

General/About:

Our Vintage Leather collection is a top-grain leather that is carefully finished to accentuate its natural surface markings, textures and colour variations. Each hide is as unique as a fingerprint.

During the specialist finishing process, a protective surface of wax is hand rubbed onto each hide to achieve a slightly distressed appearance. When the product is first unpacked, you may notice a waxy film on the surface of the leather or appearing as grey dust - this is part of the unique finishing process, which will sink into the hide with use to create a rich smooth lustre. Over time, the natural surface markings will deepen into a beautiful aged look. Rub gently with a dry cloth to bring out the shine.

We go to great lengths to use only the highest quality leather, but variations are just part of the individual appearance of this furniture. Wrinkles, bites, scars, creases and colour variations are common on leather furniture and distinguish genuine leather from man-made look-a-likes.

For Regular Maintenance:

Dust gently with a soft dry cloth to keep it free of surface dirt.

Noticeable soiling can be wiped with a clean damp cloth.

Things to Avoid:

Be careful not to soak or vigorously rub the leather and always wipe with a dry cloth after cleaning.

Never use detergent on a leather. Consult a specialist leather upholstery cleaner if badly soiled/stained.

The finish does not need nourishing so there is no need to use any maintenance products.

Watch out for sharp objects as this could scratch the leather.

Keep your leather piece out of direct sunlight to avoid fading.

Place away from direct heat or radiators.

Do not place hot plates/mugs or any heated elements to the arms or seats of your leather piece.

Neck Wrinkles:

This is a natural characteristic found on all hides. Depending on the age and fat of the animal this will vary.

Belly Wrinkles

These are natural characteristics found on all hides. This will vary depending on the physical makeup of the animal.

Grain Variation:

These are unique features of the organic material. They will vary based on the location and the type of the animal. All leather types will contain multiple grain structures.

Unique Scars

These markings tell a story of the animal and vary based off of the animals activity and journey. You will sometimes find scars and scratches individual to the animal.
